Council Meeting
July 6, 2000
7:30 p.m.-Pitts Center

1. Mayor called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.
2. Jim Morrison led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Mayor Sutherland asked that a moment of silence be held for the family of Paul Dunlap and for those who gave their lives to guarantee the freedom we celebrate each Independence Day.
4. Dare County Tourist Board Presentation-Carolyn McCormick, Executive Director

Mayor Sutherland introduced Ms. Carolyn McCormick, Managing Director of Dare County Tourism Bureau, who presented a slide show explaining where the tourist dollars are spent and how Dare County allocates the tourism related revenue. For instances, without tax dollars Southern Shores ad valorem taxes would increase by 8.9 cents.

Councilman Smith addressed his concern regarding the evacuation of the tourists in the event of a hurricane and suggested that the Tourist Board lobby the legislators in building the Mid-County Bridge in Corolla.

David Jones, Martin's Point resident, expressed his concern about the high cost of administrative fees shown by Ms. McCormick. He also suggested that the Tourist Board do something about the lack of low cost housing for those working here.

Warren Judge, Chairman of the Outer Banks Visitor's Board, explained that the administrative fees cover everything, not just salaries. He also stated that the Chamber of Commerce is concerned about the lack of affordable housing and there has been discussion regarding this. He explained that the Tourist Board gives grants and that there are rules and regulations that need to be followed. He said that they are not in the development business.

Mayor Sutherland thanked them for coming.

5. Consent Agenda

Mayor presented the consent agenda consisting of minutes of the June 6, 2000 Council meeting and the joint Council/Martin's Point meeting May 17, 2000, the monthly Building Inspections report and the monthly tax report. Councilman Campbell made a motion to adopt the consent agenda as presented. Councilman Smith seconded. Approved unanimously.

6. Planning Board Report

Chairman Morrison submitted the report dated June 19, 2000. The Planning Board recommends to Council approval of the site plan for the remodeling of the Pitts Center.

Chairman Morrison presented the two zoning ordinance amendments for the public hearings to be held at this meeting.

7. Public Hearings

a. Lot Coverage Ordinance

Mayor Sutherland opened the first public hearing at 8:05 p.m. and read the proposed lot coverage amendment. No one signed up to speak and Council had no comment. Mayor Sutherland closed the hearing. Councilman Denny made a motion to adopt the lot coverage amendment as presented. Councilman Campbell seconded. Approved unanimously.

b. Estuarine Bulkheads Ordinance

Mayor Sutherland opened the second public hearing at 8:09 p.m. and presented the proposed estuarine bulkhead amendment. No one signed up to speak and Council had no comment. Mayor Sutherland closed the public hearing at 8:10 p.m. Councilman Campbell made a motion to adopt the estuarine bulkhead as presented. Councilman Smith seconded. Approved unanimously.

Councilman Campbell made a motion to approve the site plan for the remodeling of the Pitts Center as presented. Councilman Smith seconded. Approved unanimously.

8. Old Business

a. Resolution-Mayor by Popular Vote

Mayor Sutherland read the resolution. Councilman Kennedy made a motion to adopt the resolution as presented. Councilman Campbell seconded. Approved unanimously. Mayor Sutherland stated that a public hearing would be held at the August meeting regarding the proposed ordinance.

Old Business cont'd

b. Personal Watercraft Ordinance Committee

Councilman Campbell reported that he and Councilman Smith met with John Finelli and Thomas Franchi, from Martin's Point, to discuss amending the Town's PWC ordinance. He stated that progress is ongoing.

Councilman Denny stated that he has been contacted by Martin's Point residents to allow jet skis in the creek. Councilman Smith commented that is in the discussion.

Mayor Sutherland stated that he has received calls from residents reporting how happy they are not to hear jet skis. He reported that five citations have been issued.

c. Martin's Point Update and Resolution

Mayor Sutherland read the resolution. The resolution states that the Town Council has no intent now or in the foreseeable future to consider annexation of Martin's Point except and unless more than 50% of the residents request annexation by the Town. (See attached)

Mayor Sutherland stated that the parties involved are on a positive track. He stated that it is Council's intention to relinquish the zoning control over Martin's Point residential area but to retain Extra Territorial Jurisdiction and zoning control over the commercial area and Extra Territorial Jurisdiction over Ginguite Bay to the Martin's Point shoreline.

Mayor Sutherland stated that there still is the need for a representative from Martin's Point to be on the Board of Adjustment and the Planning Board.

Mayor Sutherland stated that it has been said over and over that the Town has no intention of annexing Martin's Point and that Martin's Point has agreed to withdraw their legislative petition.

Councilman Denny submitted a second resolution for Council's consideration.

Councilman Smith made a motion to adopt the original resolution. Councilman Campbell seconded.

Councilman Campbell stated that a cover letter would be written and it would state the position of the Council. He doesn't feel the position of Council needs to be in the actual resolution.

Councilman Denny stated that he objects to the original resolution because it did not address the required action to end the dispute. He stated that the resolution should state that there would be no hostile takeover while this Council is in tact and that Martin's Point is withdrawing the petition to the Legislature.

Councilman Kennedy agrees with the original resolution.

Councilman Campbell stated that the issue needs to be resolved as quickly as possible.

Old Business cont'd

Councilman Denny stated that it would be timely to demonstrate to Martin's Point that the ordinance is on the way but that it has not been drafted and that a public hearing will need to be held.

Tom White, Town Attorney, commented that these are legislative acts and could be rescinded.

David Jones, Martin's Point Homeowners Association President, stated that he agrees and understands the procedure. He also stated that this proceeding is based on mutual trust and he commends Council for their efforts.

Council approved unanimously the original resolution as presented.

d. Site Plan for Kern P. Pitts Center remodeling.

Approved under ~~Planning Board report~~ *Public Hearings*

Mayor Sutherland made a presentation to Jodi Hess for her many volunteer hours in reviewing the Town's minutes and ordinances at Council's request. She received a Town flag and pin.

9. New Business

a. Fire Department Contract

Tom Gjestson, Town Manager, presented the annual volunteer fire department contract in the amount of \$187,400.00. He stated that the contract is the same as last year except it has decreased by nine thousand dollars. Councilman Campbell made a motion to adopt the contract as presented and authorizes the mayor to sign. Councilman Smith seconded. Approved unanimously.

b. Announce bids for Pitts Center remodeling

Councilman Smith reported that Olin Finch was the lowest bidder at \$16,820.00. He stated that three bids were received and that the other two bids, Old Station Construction and Waldt Construction were over \$18,000.00.

c. Food Lion Expansion

Mayor Sutherland reported that the Food Lion at the Marketplace is expanding to 54,000 sq. ft. He said that it would be the same size as the one in Kill Devil Hills.

Councilman Campbell asked Mike Hejduk, Code Enforcement Administrator, if there has been a resolution to the septic problem at the Marketplace? M. Hejduk stated that corrective action is being addressed. He stated that a demolition permit has been issued to the Food Lion so that they may begin the expansion project.

New Business cont'd

Councilman Denny asked the audience if they were interested in what is being discussed regarding the septic issue? The audience replied that they were interested.

M. Hejduk explained that the Marketplace has a 15-year old low-pressure septic system. He commented that Wilco (Construction Company) has asked about extended working hours and temporary approval of storage in the parking lot. He stated that there is no safety hazard at this time in regards to the septic issue but would advise that the drainfield behind the East Carolina Bank not be walked on. He stated that Dare County is on top the problem and investigating the system and if a hazard would be found the Town would be notified

d. Cable Franchise Study

Mayor Sutherland reported that the County is asking the municipalities to participate in a study to negotiate a contract with Charter Communications. He reported that Sam Scialabba, General Manager, came to the workshop and said that he would be happy to sit down with the Towns and negotiate. Council agreed that they did not want to participate in the County's study.

e. Purchase of additional satellite receiver for Town EOC

Mayor Sutherland reported that the satellite receiver has been purchased and will be installed soon.

f. Appointment to the Outer Banks Builder's Task Force

Mayor Sutherland suggested that M. Hejduk be the Town's representative. Councilman Campbell stated that it is the Town's goal to maintain a separate municipality and not be a part of a consolidation. He stated that he is a little wary of some of the goals stated in the proposed letter from the O.B. Home Builders task force. All agreed that M. Hejduk should be the representative.

10. Public Comment

John Albree thanked the building inspections department for their help during his remodeling project.

Pete Macfarlane reported that several utility cables are lying on the ground and have been there for quite some time. He would like Council to push Sprint or Bobby Owens to have cables placed underground.

Jodi Hess reported that Charlotte Underwood with Sprint was very helpful to them and should be called regarding the burying of cables.

Mayor Sutherland stated that Council would look into calling Sprint and the Charter Communications, the cable company.

Public Comment cont'd

Bob Deacon commented that the delivery of phone books is not handled properly. He stated that they are just flung out of the car window and since there are seasonal renters and the books are not getting picked up this could alert burglars to know when someone is not at home.

Elva Aukland asked Council to consider placing a multi-use path along S. Dogwood. She commented that since the Town is a friendly, family environment area and that multi-use paths are in other areas of the Town that this is an area that also needs one. She explained that road is narrow and many people do use the road to walk and ride bikes and that Kitty Hawk Elementary School is there also. She asked if Council would consider it as a 2, 5 or 10-year plan?

11. Council Agenda

Councilman Denny reported that the street repair for the FY99/00 is over schedule but should be finished in 3-4 days.

Councilman Denny discussed an appropriate time for the dedication of the multi-use path. He suggested the August Council meeting. No exact time was confirmed.

Al Smith asked about the pot hole repair? Tom Gjestson said that the repairing of potholes has begun.

Councilman Kennedy stated that he is glad to be back from vacation.

Councilman Campbell had no further comment.

Councilman Smith had no further comment.

12. Mayor's Agenda

Mayor Sutherland reported that at the last Council meeting Council approved a resolution regarding the burying of underground cable for a combined fee to be shared by all users. He explained that the way that Council wrote the resolution is not possible since the tax district discussed in the legislation would not permit earmarking taxes collected in Southern Shores to be used only in Southern Shores. Council could decide not to petition to be a part of the special tax district set up by Dare County. Council agreed.

Mayor Sutherland announced that the Town received many emails saying "thank you" for lowering the taxes in Town. He read one from Jack DelBuono

Mayor Sutherland congratulated the Fire Dept on what a great job they do.

13. Town Manager's Agenda

Tom Gjestson asked David Bakken, Fire Chief, to give monthly fire report. (submitted)

Town Manager's Agenda cont'd

David Bakken also wanted to congratulate Pete Macfarlane for his 20 years of volunteerism to the fire department.

Mayor Sutherland congratulated Pete and also David Bakken as the new Fire Chief. The audience gave them a big round of applause.

Tom Gjestson announced that Lt. Sheila Merriman has resigned her post to return to Hope Mills to be with her family. He said that everyone will miss her and appreciated all that she has done for the Town. He stated that the position of lieutenant would not be filled but that a position for a second sergeant would be opened.

Tom Gjestson presented a budget ordinance amendment (BO-001) increasing the 2000/2001 street budget by \$90,000 with funds to be appropriated from the undesignated fund balance. Mayor Sutherland made a motion to adopt the budget ordinance as presented. Councilman Campbell seconded. Approved unanimously.

Tom Gjestson reported that the Blue Sky Foundation has given up the office space in the Pitts Center and has removed their property. They have expressed some interest in holding some training sessions here but will be based in Raleigh.

Tom Gjestson reported that bids are out for the roof repairs of the Town Hall and the Police garage.

Tom Gjestson reviewed the pay policy and benefits changes proposed in the budget message including a 3% COLA and average 2% merit raises for FY 00/01 as approved by the Town Manager. Council agreed.

Tom Gjestson gave a list of items to be discussed at the next workshop:

- Roller Blade ordinance
- Draft emergency ordinance revision
- Changing the Town's vehicle license to a 3-year license
- Junk car ordinance review

Chief Brazell reported that the Wachovia Bank robbery in the Marketplace came to a good end (by capturing the individual) due to the joint cooperation of the Dare and Currituck Sheriff's Dept. and the way the Southern Shores officers handled the incident.

Tom Gjestson reported that 35 applications have been submitted for the financial support assistant position and interviews will be forthcoming.

Councilman Campbell commented that the discussion of the 3-year Town license came up at the retreat held in February and that the list may need to be reviewed to see if there are other items to discuss.

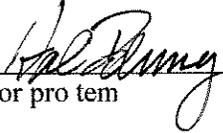

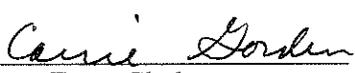
Councilman Campbell made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 9:20 p.m. Mayor Sutherland seconded. Approved unanimously.

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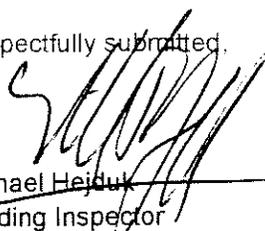

PLANNING BOARD MEETING RECAP

6/19/00

Prepared by Jim Morrison for Council Workshop 6/27/00

1. Site Plan Review – Crown station restaurant (Wendy's). The proposed site includes only a parking lot and drainfield in Southern Shores. Remaining changes are all in Kitty Hawk. This plan complies with our ordinance regarding properties in both jurisdictions. The Building Inspector submitted site plan review comments to the Board. Traffic was discussed, however the applicant is not increasing driveway access points along Route 12 and we have no ordinance that would prevent continuing this access to his property. The applicant must provide a tentative approval by the applicable Health agency of the sewage treatment and disposal facilities, however that was not received in time for our meeting. If it is not received by the Building Inspector by the date of your Workshop, this site plan will not be submitted for the July Council meeting. ***The Planning Board recommends approval, subject to receipt of a tentative approval of the sewage treatment and disposal facilities on or before June 27.***
2. Site Plan Review – Pitts Center Exterior revisions to meet assembly uses. ***The Planning Board recommends approval of the submitted site plan revision.***
3. Discussion Regarding Blinken Proposal – Property between Town Hall and Southern Shores Realty. Mr. Blinken came with only a sketch plan regarding restaurant/retail/office development of the subject property. He indicated he was not submitting a site plan, but wanted a “sense of the Planning Board” regarding the Town “working with him” to develop the property. He had been given a letter from Mike Hejduk, indicating the areas in which his proposal would not comply with zoning ordinances. The greatest disparity is his proposal to use a currently residential lot north of the Realty company to gain an additional access to Route 12. Our ordinances clearly prohibit a commercial use or accessory use extending outside the commercial district. He seems to want the Town to broker a deal with him whereby we would devise a trade-off of access to Town property from the site in return for a rezoning of the residential lot. We explained this was not the role of the Planning Board, and that the Land Use Plan clearly opposed adding to our commercial district. (Not said at the meeting, but I also believe it would be detrimental to add to our commercial district while we are counting on its small size to protect us from SOB uses in our Town.) We told Mr. Blinken that the Planning Board has no role in acting as a champion for a developer's proposal, that there is no provision for informal comment on developer proposals, and that he must come to us with a specific site plan or proposal in order to get a Planning Board recommendation vote. The Planning Board had a discussion after he left regarding general traffic in the area of the Crown station, and is concerned about any final solution the State may propose. We wondered whether the Town has ongoing discussions about the State's current plan. Do we?
4. Ongoing Tasks:
 - Towers Ordinance:* Mimi Iacone will draft the proposal.
 - Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance:* Dan Shields will draft changes to correct flood district nomenclature in the ordinance. The zone names have changed over time.
 - Mallard Cove:* Mike Hejduk will assemble as-built site plans and make a recommendation at our July meeting. We asked that a Mallard Cove Board member(s) attend.
 - Tree Ordinance:* I will contact the two large civic associations to determine if there is any interest in reviving this Land Use Plan item.



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BO 00/01-1

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**RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO PROVIDE
FOR THE ELECTION OF THE MAYOR
BY POPULAR VOTE**

WHEREAS at the present time the Mayor of The Town of Southern Shores is elected from the Town Council by its members to serve at the pleasure of the Council;

AND WHEREAS a number of the citizens have expressed a desire that the Mayor be elected by popular vote of the qualified electorate and the Town Council agrees that the method of election of the Mayor of the Town should be determined by the qualified voters of Southern Shores;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that The Town Council of The Town of Southern Shores intends to consider an ordinance amending the Charter of the Town to provide for the election of the Mayor by the qualified voters of the Town pursuant to North Carolina General Statute 160A-101(8)a. And further, that the Mayor shall be elected for a term of office of four years beginning with the municipal elections held in November of the year 2001 to take office on the date of the first meeting of the Town Council in December of 2001. The Mayor so elected shall have the right to vote on all issues before the Town Council. Further, the ordinance amending the Town Charter to provide for the election of the Mayor by the qualified voters of the Town shall become effective only if approved by a vote of the electorate at the general election held on the 1st Tuesday in November, 2000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a public hearing be held on the proposed charter amendment at 9 o'clock A.M. on the 1st day of August, 2000 in the council chambers of the Town of Southern Shores.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHERN SHORES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Shores, North Carolina, that the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Southern Shores be amended as follows:

PART I.

A. Amend Article VII. SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, Section 7.01 RS-1 Single Family Residential District, B. Permitted Uses to add:

6. Estuarine bulkheads. Estuarine bulkheads must be permitted by all applicable local, state, and federal agencies having jurisdiction.

B. Amend Article VII. SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, Section 7.02 RS-8 Multi-Family Residential District, B. Permitted Uses to add:

8. Estuarine bulkheads. Estuarine bulkheads must be permitted by all applicable local, state, and federal agencies having jurisdiction.

C. Amend Article VII. SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, Section 7.03 RS-10 Multi-Family Residential District, B. Permitted Uses to add:

8. Estuarine bulkheads. Estuarine bulkheads must be permitted by all applicable local, state, and federal agencies having jurisdiction.

D. Amend Article VII. SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, Section 7.04 R-1 Low Density Residential District, B. Permitted Uses to add:

6. Estuarine bulkheads. Estuarine bulkheads must be permitted by all applicable local, state, and federal agencies having jurisdiction.

E. Amend Article VII. SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, Section 7.05 ET-1 Extra-Territorial Residential District, B. Permitted Uses to add:

6. Estuarine bulkheads. Estuarine bulkheads must be permitted by all applicable local, state, and federal agencies having jurisdiction.

F. Amend Article VII. SCHEDULE OF DISTRICT REGULATIONS, Section 7.10
C – General Commercial District, B. Permitted Uses to add:

7. Estuarine bulkheads. Estuarine bulkheads must be permitted by all applicable local, state, and federal agencies having jurisdiction.

PART II. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

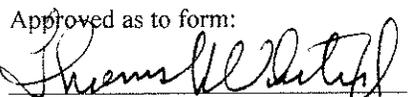

If this ordinance or the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or application of the ordinance which can be given separate effect and to that end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.
