GENERAL INFORMATION

Applicant: Town of Southern Shores

Requested Action: Amendment of the Town Code by amending Town Code Section 1-2 by adding definitions for “development” and “development approval” and by amending Town Code Section 16-4(b)(3)a.3. to allow submittal of a FEMA approved form, survey, or other documentation prepared by a licensed professional that demonstrates that the natural grade of a parcel exceeds the RFPE of eight feet instead of an under construction and finished construction elevation certificate in shaded X and X flood zones

ANALYSIS

At the February 6, 2024 Town Council meeting, the Town Council directed Town Staff to draft Town Code amendments to modernize the Town Code. As a result, Town Staff has drafted TCA-24-01 which includes amendments to Town Code Section 1-2 by adding definitions for “development” and “development approval” as defined in N.C.G.S. 160D-102. Town Staff is also proposing to amend Town Code Section 16-4(b)(3)a.3. to allow submittal of a FEMA approved form, survey, or other documentation prepared by a licensed professional that demonstrates that the natural grade of a parcel exceeds the RFPE of eight feet, instead of an under construction and finished construction elevation certificate in shaded X and X flood zones.

Currently, a survey or an under construction elevation certificate and finished construction elevation certificate are required to demonstrate that the natural grade of a parcel exceeds the RFPE of eight feet in shaded X and X flood zones. The proposed language would allow the submittal of a survey, a FEMA approved form (such as an elevation certificate), or other documentation prepared by a licensed professional that demonstrates that the natural grade of a parcel exceeds the RFPE of eight feet (such as a letter, elevation certificate on file, or other written certification).

RECOMMENDATION

Town Staff has determined that the proposed amendments are consistent with the Town’s currently adopted Land Use Plan and Town Staff recommends that the Planning Board recommend approval of the proposed amendments to the Town Council.
